

Identifying Core Attributes for New Rural Program Sustainability

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Brad Walsh, MD – Appointed as Program Director for UAMS Regional Centers (Crossett) RTP in 2021. Graduated from UAMS AHEC Pine Bluff Family Medicine Residency in 2009. He practiced full scope Family Medicine (excluding OB) in his hometown of Crossett, AR for many years before transitioning into ambulatory care only. He practices with his father who has served the same community for the last 40 years. He carries adjunct faculty appointments to New York Institute Technology College of Osteopathic Medicine in Jonesboro, AR and University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences College of Medicine in Little Rock, AR.

James Clardy, MD – Director of the Center for Graduate Medical Education at UAMS. He oversees efforts to increase residency slots and improve the quality of new and existing training programs throughout the state for UAMS, focusing on developing rural medical training. He has previously served as the Associate Dean for GME, Associate Dean and Professor of Psychiatry, and was the Program Director for UAMS Psychiatry Residency. He recently ended a six-year membership on the ACGME Institutional Review Committee and now serves in the group who hears Institutional appeals.

H. Marks Attwood, MD - 1984 graduate of the AHEC Pine Bluff Family Medicine Residency, is currently Associate Professor of Family Medicine at UAMS and the assistant Program Director at Regional Programs South Campus in Magnolia, AR. Serves as Principal Investigator for UAMS Regional Centers Primary Care Training and Enhancement: Residency Training in Primary Care Grant. Also, the former AHEC Center Director for AHEC Pine Bluff and Residency Director from 2006 to 2013 at AHEC Pine Bluff.



Rural Training Program location. 25 Bed Critical Access Hospital located in Crossett, Arkansas. New construction of building in 1998, but hospital established for over 100 years - county owned and operated. Town of 4,700 people with medical services to over 10,000 in the rural southeast corner of the state near the Mississippi Delta.



Alliance of 18 rural healthcare organizations and 3 medical schools with a mission to provide resources to rural members. Administers HRSA Rural Residency Program Development grant for the RTP.



Arkansas's only state supported academic health system. UAMS Regional Centers program was founded in 1973 as a second generation AHEC system with 8 regional campuses as the rural outreach effort for UAMS. Seven of the campuses have a university administered, community-based Family Medicine Residency within their campus.
